High-quality public preschool is one of the best investments the public can make in education. Iowa's public and private schools have dramatically expanded access to high-quality preschools, thanks to the commitment of lowans to this effort. We support providing full funding for the Statewide Voluntary Preschool Program for students at or below 180% of the federal poverty level.

#### **Why Preschool Matters**

#### **Learning gaps begin before kindergarten**

A great preschool program can benefit any child. But early learning efforts are especially important to ensure the success of low-income students, who often start behind their more affluent peers.



#### 90%

Before age five, 90% of a child's brain develops



#### 30 million

Low-income children hear up to 30 million fewer words than their more affluent peers before entering school



#### Nine vs. 22

By age five, a typical middle-class child recognizes 22 letters compared to nine for a child in a low-income family



#### 975

A low-income child has 975 fewer hours of one-on-one picture book reading than their middle-class peers


