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Tip—Understand the Authority of the School Board





Authority as a Whole Body

Board works as a whole, at the board table

Deliberations & decisions "in the view of the public"

Common misperceptions about board authority

Avoid making promises, especially before learning background information

Avoid Making Promises—Some Cautions Authority of the Board— As a Whole Body Give yourself a chance to learn before the board votes. The board's authority exists when deciding as a body. You are only one vote.

Maintain "Big Picture" View

- Board role—governance Superintendent role—management
- Serve as a governance team with the superintendent—while having different duties

Guiding documents: vision, mission & goals/priorities

Key initiatives (teaching, learning, programs & facilities)

State of the district—other areas: staffing trends, district boundaries, etc.
