

Tip—Understand the Authority of the School Board





Authority as a Whole Body

Board works as a whole, at the board table.

Deliberations & decisions "in the view of the public."

Common misperceptions about board authority.

Avoid Making Promises—Some Cautions




Authority of the Board— As a Whole Body

Give yourself a chance to learn before the board votes.

The board's authority exists when deciding as a body.

You are only one vote.



Maintain "Big Picture" View

Board role—Governance. Superintendent role—Management.

Serve as a governance team with the superintendent—while having different duties.

Big Considerations

Enrollment: A big influencer—What are the trends?

Silos: Separate "pots" of funding.

July 1–June 30: The district's fiscal year.

It takes time to learn. There is support.

Be persistent. You are not alone.

Beyond 1–2 meetings per month.

Committees and other obligations.

Review materials before board meetings.

Engage in continued learning with IASB.


