Chronic Absenteeism & Student Risk Levels

We know that when students aren't present, they miss the valuable learning opportunities provided through instruction and engagement in school. Chronic absenteeism can have a negative impact on a student's achievement. What exactly does this look like in lowa schools? In their 2023–24 Spring BEDS data, the Department of Education reported the average daily attendance for students in grades K-12 at 92.65%. Let's break this down further to see what this looks like in school. Below you can find the attendance rates, chronic absenteeism rates, and at-risk percentages of two different sample districts.


2023–24 Iowa Public School District K-8 & K-12 Average Daily Attendance
