STATE REVENUE PROJECTIONS FROM THE DECEMBER REC MEETING

The Revenue Estimating Conference (REC) met Dec. 13, 2023, to revise their estimate for FY 2024 net General Fund Receipts (including transfers). They agreed to decrease the estimate by \$6.3 million compared to the estimates they made in October.
