



School Districts Participating in Whole Grade Sharing in FY 2021

The Department of Education collects information pertaining to a school district's participation in whole grade sharing arrangements, including districts that have tuition agreements to share grades with other districts. In general:

- One-way sharing arrangements: A school district sends students in specified grades to one or more districts for instruction purposes and does not receive students in return from those districts.
- Two-way sharing arrangements: A school district sends students in specified grades to one or more districts and in return, receives students from specified grades from at least one of those districts.

Districts participating in whole grade sharing arrangements may be eligible for supplementary weighting if the participating school boards have passed a resolution to study a reorganization on or before July 1, 2024. The Department of Education [provides guidance on whole grade sharing](#), including specific information on eligibility for supplementary weighting.

The following [map](#) and [tables](#) provide information on the districts that are participating in whole grade sharing in the 2020-21 school year.

- There are currently 40 school districts participating in one-way sharing, including 18 sending out whole grades, and 22 school districts receiving those students.
- There are currently 14 school districts participating in two-way sharing.
