


Certified Enrollments: October 2020 vs. October 2019 and Potential Impact on the FY 2022 Budget Guarantee Amount

The Iowa Department of Education released the certified enrollment counts from this past October. With this new data, IASB has updated the following enrollment data tools:

 <u>Certified Enrollment Comparison Tool</u>: Provides current and historical data on certified enrollments including enrollment trend data for each of the variables included in the certified enrollment file. Additionally, this tool allows for comparison between districts on the various elements included in the certified enrollment.

The following map provides the percentage change in certified enrollment from the October 2019 count to the October 2020 count (please click here or on the map for a larger version). Of the 327 school districts, 107 districts (32.7%) had an increase in enrollment, 215 districts (67.3%) had a decrease or no increase (five districts had no change in enrollment). Overall, total enrollment decreased by 5,935.9 (-1.2%). Click here for enrollment data of all districts. The steep enrollment decrease stops the trend of statewide enrollment increases and is likely the result of parental enrollment decisions related to the COVID-19 pandemic.



The following table and chart show the overall enrollment changes by enrollment category. Of note:


- All enrollment categories had a decrease in total enrollments.
- The 2,500 to 7,499 enrollment category had half their districts with an enrollment increase and half with an enrollment decrease.
- All other enrollment categories had more districts with an enrollment decrease than an enrollment increase.

FY 2022 Budget Guarantee Implications

The FY 2022 Supplemental State Aid (SSA) state percent of growth rate will be set in the upcoming legislative session. The following table shows the estimated statewide budget guarantee amounts at different SSA state percent of growth rates. Note that budget guarantee is funded entirely through local property taxes and requires adoption of a board resolution prior to budget certification.
