


Immigrant Students


The lowa Department of Education collects individual student enrollment data through the Student Reporting data collection each fall. Included in that collection are students that are identified as an immigrant. Per the <u>Department's Student Reporting in Iowa data dictionary</u>, an immigrant student is identified as:

The term "immigrant children and youth," which is defined in Section 3201(5) of the ESEA, refers to individuals who: (A) are aged 3 through 21; (B) were not born in any State; and (C) have not been attending one or more schools in any one or more States for more than 3 full academic years. Note that "State" is defined in Section 3201(13) of the ESEA to include the 50 States, the District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico. Therefore, students born in Puerto Rico may not be included as "immigrant" students under Title III. Finally, note that the term "immigrant" as used in Title III is not related to an individual's legal status in the United States.

The following two charts and table provide information on immigrant students from the 2005-06 to 2020-21 school years. Included in the information is the number of immigrant students, the percentage of immigrant students to the total K-12 enrollment, the number of districts with at least one immigrant student, and the percentage of districts with at least one immigrant student. While the number of and percentage of immigrant students has increased over the time frame, the number and percentage of school districts with immigrant students had decreased, in general, until recently.
